VP of Alliances: DMTF Releases CIM-SPL Standard

On September 14, 2009, DMTF <u>announced</u> the release of its <u>Common</u> <u>Information Model Simplified Policy Language</u> (CIM-SPL) standard. CIM-SPL provides a standard language for writing system management policies based on CIM profiles, enabling IT personnel to more effectively manage their computing resources.

CIM-SPL can be used with any CIM-based implementation, including those comprising DMTF's <u>DASH</u>, <u>SMASH</u> and <u>VMAN</u> initiatives. This standard is critical for enabling organizations to take full advantage of DMTF standards for effective, interoperable IT management. Because CIM is the basis for most DMTF standards, IT personnel can use CIM-SPL to greatly simplify the process of adding automation policies that can be integrated into a wide variety of DMTF- enabled management systems.

The CIM-SPL standard can also be utilized within cloud computing applications, as it helps enable automatic management of cloud systems. The concept of self-service is fundamental for the success of applications in the cloud, requiring automatic deployment of resources as needed. Automation becomes essential in this environment. CIM-SPL can be used to create policies that support automation of these management tasks.

The <u>CIM-SPL specification</u> is available for download.

Profiles:

 Indications Profile (DSP1054): The Indications Profile defines the CIM elements used to subscribe for indications of unsolicited events and a server-side implementation used to advertise the possible indications, as well as the content of an indication used to report events in a managed system.

Event Recaps: BrightTALK Configuration Management Database Summit

On September 17, 2009, <u>BrightTALK</u> hosted an online Configuration Management Database (CMDB) Summit. The summit featured presentations by IT thought leaders who discussed real life examples of using CMDBs and how they must be successfully integrated with multiple data sources to track changes and maintain accurate, secure data for business decision making. Each Web cast was live and interactive, allowing viewers to ask questions, respond to polls and offer feedback after the presentation.

Mark Johnson, DMTF's CMDBf Work Group Chair, gave a <u>presentation</u> titled CMDB Federation: DMTF Standards for Federating Configuration Management Data and MDRs. The presentation discussed how federation technology may be used to balance the need to integrate data from various data repositories with a need to manage the data in each repository separately.
