## DMTF Makes a Splash with DASH

The DMTF recently announced the Desktop and mobile Architecture for System Hardware (DASH) Initiative – a forthcoming suite of specifications that takes full advantage of the DMTF's Web Services for Management (WS-Management) specification – delivering standards-based Web services management for desktop and mobile client systems. The DASH Initiative is a breakthrough and will provide the **next generation of standards for secure out-of-band and remote management of desktop and mobile systems**. Full details of this Initiative are available in the newly released [DASH White Paper](#), developed by the DMTF's Desktop and Mobile Work Group (DMWG).

Delivering a set of specifications that provides architectural semantics, industry standard protocols and a set of profiles, the DASH Initiative will **standardize the secure management of desktop and mobile systems independent of machine state, operating platform or vendor**. By tapping into the power of WS-Management, which enables a common way for systems to access and exchange management information across the entire IT infrastructure, DASH integrates desktop and laptop management into an end-to-end management solution. In addition, DASH works in concert with the DMTF's widely-implemented Common Information Model (CIM), so that it is easily incorporated into existing management environments.

## DASH and SMASH Demonstrated at MMS

At [Microsoft Management Summit \(MMS\)](#), held March 26–30, 2007, in San Diego, the DMTF booth included multi-vendor demonstrations of the latest standards for **interoperable distributed management**, including the organization's DASH and Systems Management Architecture for Server Hardware (SMASH) Initiatives.

The DMTF's two prototype demonstrations of DASH featured participation by AMD, Avocent, Broadcom and Dell, utilizing two desktop target platforms and two console systems to show the **advanced desktop management capabilities** of this Initiative. In addition, the DMTF provided a demonstration of the SMASH Initiative, utilizing solutions from AMD, Avocent and Dell.

Following on the success of the organization's presence at last year's event, MMS 2007 provided an even greater forum to showcase the **prominence of DMTF technologies** in the management space to the more than 3,000 IT professionals in attendance. The DMTF's DASH and SMASH demos at MMS delivered important evidence of the real-world applicability of these standards.

## System Management Forum Chartered

The DMTF has recently approved the charter for the System Management Forum (SMF), which is responsible for developing and implementing programs for verifying compliance of **software and hardware that implement DMTF system management standards**. The SMF succeeds the SMASH Forum and incorporates its mission, and will also address the DASH Initiative.

As the DMTF's two systems management Initiatives, there are opportunities for DASH and SMASH to share testing tools, program formats and maximize the existing interoperability infrastructure. The SMF will also promote adoption of those standards through programs and activities that allow developers to validate and show the interoperability of their implementations.

The activities in the scope of the mission of SMF include:

- Developing test tools for use in compliance and validation testing
- Developing and maintaining suites of tests
- Developing and running compliance verification programs
- Issuing credentials to implementations which exhibit compliance
- Holding plugfests
